<p>Issuing of joint diplomas is possible according to the law on higher education.</p> <p>Pursuant to Article 168 of the Act of 27 July 2005, the Law on Higher Education, degree programmes of the first and second cycle as well as long cycle may be provided jointly by various higher education institutions, including foreign and other academic or research institutions on the basis of an agreement concluded between them. Such an agreement may specify the fields and cycles of degree programmes to be provided jointly; however Polish academic units which are parties to the agreement, shall be required to have an authorization for the provision of degree programmes at cycles corresponding to those included in the agreement.</p> <p>Graduates of the above programmes may be awarded a joint diploma in compliance with the requirements laid down in Regulation of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of 11 September 2011.</p>
