National Higher Education Strategy on Internationalisation		
The issue of HE internationalisation has not been regulated by a separate strategy paper so far.		
Development of a strategic approach towards the internationalisation of initial and continuous education, as well as promotion of the mobility is being mentioned throughout the text of the <i>Strategy for Development of Education in Serbia 2020</i> .		
Two on-going Tempus projects - <i>Fostering University Support Services and Procedures for Full Participation in the European Higher Education Area (FUSE)</i> and <i>Strengthening of Internationalisation Policies at Universities in Serbia (SIPUS)</i> are expected to produce a number of important documents related to the topic of internationalization at the level of higher education.		
Individual universities are also developing strategies on internationalization which are to be adopted at the institutional level.
