Drivers internationalization policy

- Further integrate the institution into the emerging global knowledge and learning network, both to contribute to it and to benefit from it
- To realize an environment that enables students to develop into global citizens
 - Erasmus of Rotterdam: “I am a citizen of the world”



English programs

- 8 Bachelors programs

- 26 Master programs

- 3(+1) joint degree programs, in addition to double degree programs
 - The European Master in Law and Economics (EMLE) (Erasmus School of Law)
 - The European Master of Science (Erasmus Medical Center)
 - Erasmus Mundus Master Program in Public Policy (International Institute of Social Studies)
 - In advanced stages of preparation, European Master in Health Economics and Management at the Institute of Health Policy and Management

- 20 institutes and schools provide PhD education





Why further internationalization?

- To keep improving the quality of education and research and concomitantly maintain and improve our high rankings
- To be a significant player in the “global battle for talent”, involving both students and staff
- To create better chances for recruiting and retaining talent
